

Primordial Torah:

First a non-god thought from The Divine Mind. Then written in a spiritual form and finally used - read in the creative process.

And Torah - in a form predates creation. At first only visible in the highest spiritual realm of Atzilut. Therefore, Moshe must ascend on high to retrieve it. cf. Ps 48:18 and Eph 4:8.

Thus, where did the parchment for the Primordial Torah come from? Rev. 13:8. The lamb slain before the foundation of the world.

Primordial language - i.e. Hebrew.

Primordial - ink - ? soot - charcoal. - and other materials such as water - also considered a primordial element. Fire - for a burnt sacrifice - olah See also - Skin - (s) w the Torah written thereon.

A vision of G-d.

Impressed as white fire on skin is shining letters or black depicting the hidden nature of G-d.

G-d's skin (Arm) is said to have the Torah written thereon. According to the sages this seems to be alluded to in the idea of "white fire." G-d is a devouring fire" D'Varim 4:24; 9:3. Thus, G-d is seen as an element of fire - Talmud Shekalim 62b and Halakot.

G-d's skin - anthropomorphic - and or a possible ref. to Mashiach - Gen 1:2 BR 2:11 (B'resheet Rabba).

Written on the arm Tefillah - but also on the head - ? written on Adam Kadmon, the primordial image of G-d.
